### **Creative Therapy** - what is that?

Mary Stubbs is our Creative Therapist. Mary considers the whole person when caring for someone, taking into account their emotional, spiritual and psychological needs.

She helps our team at the hospice provide a holistic approach to medicine, going far beyond physical symptoms. Mary not only helps our patients, but their families too, supporting people through the dying process and into bereavement. Her therapies empower people to better cope with their emotional pain, help manage symptoms, provide valuable insight into a person's internal struggles and create long-lasting memories for families to cherish.



"Over the past twelve years I've helped patients and families put together a range of different items to create special lasting gifts. It's often really important work that is done in those final moments when time is really precious. It's very difficult when a loved one is ill and people are often at a loss with how to be in the room - it can be tense and often families are very loving.



Being able to give them ways to show it can really make the atmosphere a lot better.

A husband painting a silk scarf for his wife or beading a bracelet for his daughter or to have a little girl sat on her mum's bed doing little finger paintings on a keyring or a dad putting together a memory box for his son are all ways of helping families to cope and build special memories.

I find that working with families to create 'Emotional First Kits' is very helpful.

An Emotional First Aid Kit is an exercise where the parent or grandparent helps a child remember and recall coping mechanisms that they have used in the past to overcome fears and anxieties. This gives them an anchor and a strategy to call on in the bereavement process but also skills in later life"

These tokens are lasting gifts utilised over and over, and evoke memories which highlight the value of a loved one's life. They also provide a bridge which enables families to stay forever connected to their loved ones. That's why this work so important to people long after their time at the hospice.
