Ken's story is just one of the many we hear throughout our day and helps nourish the soul and lift the gloom.



Meet the team: Lisa

Say hello to Lisa, **Senior Staff Nurse** on our Wellbeing Hub team

I've been at the hospice for nearly 8 years now, first on the Inpatient Unit, then Hospice at Home, and now I'm the Senior Staff Nurse in the Wellbeing Hub. I feel like I've really found my place in nursing in this role. When you work in palliative care, this is such a valuable role as it's nice to

see people living well before they move to needing other care. Coming to work and knowing you've really helped someone is an amazing feeling. It sounds corny but it's true!

WellbeingHub

The hub has a focus on providing a safe space for people with life-limiting illnesses. Somewhere they can come and catch up with other patients, access our Creative and Complementary Therapy services, do some memory work or learn some techniques to help with relaxation, for example. It might just be that someone wants symptom management and emotional support from one of the staff on a one to one basis, or they can also come and join in with groups like nutrition support, anxiety management, and we're even starting seated yoga very soon!

It's a privilege to do this job and to have patients trust you with their thoughts and feelings. We've built an amazing community feeling here at the Wellbeing Hub, and with such a great team in place we're going from strength to strength. Everyone is so passionate about providing something so important for the community.

Fundraise in Memory: Tribute Funds



We understand that the loss of somebody close is a deeply personal experience. Tribute funds are a unique way to make a lasting tribute to a loved one and for many people, supporting a cause by concentrating your time and effort into keeping a memory alive can help with loss. In 2022 Much Loved pages raised a staggering £26,660 for Bolton Hospice.

How does it work?

Once your fund is created, you can add to it at any time. For example, you may choose to celebrate a special day or anniversary by contributing to the fund, whilst others may hold their own fundraising event or take part in one of our events such as the My Memories Walk. You will also have an online giving page where family and friends can contribute to the fund online.

Dot's Story

Doris 'Dot' Williams was referred to the Inpatient Unit in December 2022 following a month long stay at Royal Bolton Hospital.

I came in last week and it's fantastic. Absolutely fantastic. I was a bit reluctant when they suggested I came here, but I made the decision and I made the right one. They couldn't have fetched me to a better place if they'd tried. It's been wonderful. I'm so grateful for this place. I'd recommend it to anybody.

"Everybody's lovely, you can't fault the staff whatsoever. They'll do anything. Nothing's too much trouble, nothing at all. I've never met people like them in all my life. They're very special people. They're dedicated. They have feelings.

"I was in the hospital for about 4 or 5 weeks and they did their best for me but it's not like this. It's fabulous.

Doris' brother, John, had been helping to care for Doris in her home before she was admitted to the hospital and then the hospice

I came to see her when they fetched her in. The lady on the desk showed me where she was, and I walked in and the first thing my sister said was, "I love it here".

It's a big relief for me and the other family. We've been trying to cope at home having carers in, but we're not trained to cope with these things are we, so it's difficult. We got by but only just. Dot realised that which is why she accepted the offer.

As soon as you walk in, everyone's greeting you and is so friendly and helpful and kind. There's nothing that's too much trouble. It's marvellous. You can't say enough about it, and I already know I'm going to be doing fundraising for this place, as I know that's how they run. On donations.



Chloe's Story

Bolton Hospice supporter, Chloe Hampson took on the polar half marathon in Tromso, Norway to raise money for Bolton Hospice in memory of her mum.

Chloe ran the 13.1 miles in temperatures as low as -15c, and crossed the finish line in an absolutely amazing time of 2 hours! Not only that, but Chloe smashed her initial fundraising goal of $\pounds1,000$ and has raised an incredible $\pounds1,150$ for the hospice - thank you!



My mum, Tracey, died of an aggressive form of breast cancer and bone cancer, my mum was having trouble walking as the cancer had also spread to her leg. wThey replaced her bone in her leg, and everyone was doing everything they could so she could have a better quality of life before she was going to die. Sadly this didn't work and she ended up being bed bound.

The hospice was a safe place. I could sit with my mum and even sleep there if I wanted to. There were many times where I hadn't eaten before I visited, but they always had sandwiches and biscuits and drinks for us there. They cared about my family as much as my mum. Unfortunately, mum got worse and died a week later.

The hospice's bereavement team told me I would likely be going through trauma after the death, rather than just grief. They helped us through the whole process to understand what was going to happen. They had a beautiful garden which was just a nice place to be at such a horrible time.

Bolton Hospice made my mum happy and helped her the best they could. Priceless really, no amount of money could pay for this.

Try your hand at making our lemon drizzle cake recipe, the perfect addition for fundraising coffee mornings or bake sales.



Lemon Drizzle Cake

- Serves: 10 Preparation Time: 15 Cooking Time: 45
- Ingredients:
- 225g Unsalted Butter
- 222g Caster Sugar
- 4 Eggs
- · Finely grated zest of 2 lemons and juice of 1
- 225g Self-raising Flour

Toppings:

• 85g Caster Sugar

• Juice of 2 lemor

Method:

- 1. Heat the oven 180c/160c Gas Mark 4
- 2. Beat together softened butter and sugar until pale and creamy
- 3. Add the eggs 1 at a time, slowly mixing through
- 4. Mix well until combined
- 5. Line a loaf tin (8x21cm) with greaseproof paper
- 6. Spoon in the mixture and level the top with a spatula
- 7. Bake for 45-50mins until a skewer comes out clean
