# We're pleased to share some of our key milestones and achievements from 2024

January	<ul> <li>We received the Clinical Research Network's Certificate of Achievement for Greater Manchester for our contribution to the CHELsea II clinical trial.</li> <li>Chief Executive Dr (h.c.) Leigh Vallance was interviewed for a BBC North West Tonight feature on the government's 'not fit for purpose' funding model.</li> <li>Hannah Holmes returned to the hospice in her new role as Education &amp; Development Lead.</li> </ul>
February	<ul> <li>Vikki Hutchinson took up her new role as IPU Service Lead and Lisa Tate began her new role as Head of Clinical Services, leading nursing across all hospice services.</li> <li>We sent a group of supporters to trek the Sahara Desert, and they raised over £80,000 in sponsorship!</li> </ul>
March	<ul> <li>Received excellent feedback about the hospice in the Pulmonary Fibrosis Support Group AGM report.</li> </ul>
April	<ul> <li>The Care Quality Commission published their report following an on-site inspection in Dec 2023, with excellent feedback about the care and support provided by our teams and rating all areas of the hospice as Good.</li> <li>The senior leadership restructure was completed with Alice Atkinson taking up her new role as Deputy CEO, and Felicity Ransom and Adrian Vickers taking up their new roles as Head of Marketing &amp; Communications and Head of Income Generation.</li> <li>Achieved our long-term goal of 10,000 members playing our weekly lottery.</li> </ul>
May	Deputy CEO Alice Atkinson represented the hospice sector at a reception in the Houses of Parliament to highlight the manifesto for palliative and end of life care ahead of the

general election.

- CEO Dr (h.c.) Leigh Vallance presented at a seminar hosted by The King's Fund on Integrated Care Systems from a Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise sector perspective.
- Trustee Andy Morgan became the Mayor of Bolton for 2024-25.

#### June

- Lisa Ridgely took up her new post as Wellbeing Hub Sister.
- We hosted an exhibition of patient Andrew's artwork in the Wellbeing Hub to mark global MND awareness day.
- A team of staff across the hospice took part in Bolton's 5K Night Run.

#### July

- We received very positive feedback from both staff and volunteers as part of the Birdsong Survey, with improvement in 18 areas according to our staff and 4 areas according to our volunteers, since the last survey two years ago.
- We added new prizes, extra chances to win and a new rollover to our weekly lottery in part of a major change to the cost of playing from £1 to £2, generating an extra £84,000 so far.
- Trustees Judith Bromley and Sam Sherrington were awarded honorary doctorates by the University of Bolton.

#### August

- We were shortlisted in the Environmental & Sustainability category at the 2024 Bolton Business Awards in recognition of our efforts to reduce our impact on the environment.
- We hosted an 'Ice Cream Sunday' event together with Create Bolton at the Wellbeing Hub, showcasing Murmuration – a display of hand-woven starlings created by patients.
- Our Astley Bridge Shop & The Old Bank Café won the North West region category in the Charity Retail Association's inaugural UK's favourite charity shop awards.
- We brought back our popular **Bubble Rush** event for the first time since 2019, raising over £40,000.

### September

- The education team secured funding of £50,000 from the Integrated Care Board to provide education to support an increase in the number of people in Bolton with an Advance Care Plan.
- We held our first ever pre-loved fashion event at the University of Bolton.

	<ul> <li>We launched our new Staff Wellbeing Programme, a collaborative project aiming to improve wellbeing support for staff, led by Dr Jenny Short.</li> </ul>
Octobou	<ul> <li>MP for Bolton West Phil Brickell mentioned Bolton Hospice in Prime Minister's Questions during Hospice Care Week, urging the Prime Minister to provide fairer funding for hospices.</li> </ul>
October	<ul> <li>We shared our first ever impact report video at our AGM.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We hosted a very successful Diwali open day event in the Wellbeing Hub, bringing new members of our community into the hospice.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Achieved excellent rankings once again in the national Charity Shops Survey – 1<sup>st</sup> for profitability and 2<sup>nd</sup> for income growth.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>We opened two additional inpatient beds, increasing from 10 to 12 for the first time since INSERT DATE.</li> </ul>
November	<ul> <li>Following the House of Commons vote in favour of the Assisted Dying Bill, we reiterated our position to neither hasten death nor prolong life and committed to further debate and discussion on this topic next year.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Achieved record takings at our charity shops, with almost £45,000 taken in a single week.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Hosted our biggest ever gathering of volunteers, with over 200 joining us for a Christmas Party at Bolton Town Hall.</li> </ul>
December	<ul> <li>Simon Richardson completed his two-year transition project research with a report to help shape future improvement of palliative and end of life care for people with learning disabilities and autism.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>The government announced a £100 million capital funding boost for hospices over two years – a huge step forwards in securing a fairer funding deal.</li> </ul>
